• Hosted 10 Monthly Housing Workshops on Homestead Exemption, Property Tax Appeals, Energy Cost Reduction, Weatherization, Affordable Rental Readiness, Home Repair Resources

FOUNDATIO

- Put 85 emergency and critical home repair projects in the pipeline and completed 45 of these projects- securing home repair partners and connecting homeowners to services.
- Held tenant's rights workshops in partnership with AVLF.
- Completed design and permitting for Grove Park Gardens, a 110-unit affordable multi-family housing development project.

• Assisted 6 households with liens and other financial issues to maintain ownership and remain in the community.

• Hosted a 2 Day Housing Forum for homeowners and renters. 35 attended to learn about estate planning, wills preparation, home repair resources, credit repair assistance, homestead exemption, property tax information, tenant's rights, and were introduced to new affordable homeownership and rental opportunities.

Economic empowerment builds the foundation for many of our revitalization efforts in Grove Park, including our housing programs, and economic and workforce development. In 2019:

- 56 participants enrolled in the financial literacy program, bringing our cohort total to 119.
- 23 participants started small business development initiative.
- 87 residents attended the Business Credit Literacy course.
- 1 resident completed and

business development initiative.

- 12 job training referrals.
- Our 'main street' investments secured key commercial parcels.
- Removed a liquor store and other undesirable uses.





The Grove Park Foundation believes the arts and environment are critical to holistic community revitalization. All of our endeavors incorporate arts, culture and environmental sustainability. In 2019, we:

- Completed 17 new oral history recordings to bring the total to 57.
- Determined that the structural integrity of Grove Theatre was viable for redevelopment, and began site work and site engineering.
- Installed a new roof on Grove Theatre. Fox Theatre Institute provided a matching grant
- Partnered with 200 Georgia Tech students on environmental and sustainability projects, including stormwater management and greenway

A quality cradle-to-college education pipeline is essential to breaking the generational cycle of poverty. In 2019:

- KIPP Woodson Park Academy begins leadership and instruction to create a quality education pipeline for the 600+ K-5 students in the Douglass cluster.
- The Ground Breaking and construction commence for the new Woodson Park Academy campus:
  - K-8 School
  - School based health center
  - Early childhood developments center
- 150 + youth ages 11- 14 attended Summer Youth Programming.

Grove Park Foundation is committed to expanding health access and wellness opportunities for residents.In 2019:

- A Health Advisory Committee with 40 providers and stakeholders was created to dialogue about health on the West side, and a school based health center to serve students and residents.
- Created 3 partnerships for access to healthy and affordable food with Fulton Fresh Mobile Market, Historic Westside Gardens market, and Good Samaritan Health Center's diabetes prevention

program.

• The first Community 5K launched with 125 runners, including 3O+ Grove Park residents. The race was held in the heart of Grove Park,on the Proctor Creek Greenway. The race promoted wellness and assisted in building a stronger and healthier community.
